**Lesson for January 3, 2026
PROMISES ONLY TO THE OVERCOMER**

**Scripture reading Revelation 2:1-17
Memory verse: Revelation 2:11.**

1. What does the word “overcomer” mean? Genesis 32:24-28
2. In what way did Paul tell us to overcome? Romans 12:21.
3. What must we do in order to have victory over sin and temptations? I John 5:4,5.
4. What did the angel tell Jacob after he wrestled all night with him? Genesis 32:28.
5. In what way did Daniel escape death when he was cast into the Lion’s Den? Daniel 6:10,22.

6. How did the three Hebrew children escape or overcome the furnace of fire? Daniel 3:16, 17.
7. How did Paul and Silas escape the iron hand of the Romans? Acts 16:25, 26.
8. How did Jeremiah escape death when he was cast into the dungeon? Jeremiah 38:6-13.
9. If we, the children of God, are faithful to the end and overcome, what will we get? James 1:12; 1 Peter 5:4.
10. What did Christ promise to the overcomers? Revelation 2:7,11, 17,26.
11. In what way did the righteous people escape during the reign of the Papal power? Revelation 12:11

Note. The prophets overcame and were delivered through prayer and faithfulness. Jacob was an overcomer when he wrestled with the angel. He did not overcome the angel, any more than the saints overcame and conquered the Papacy, but they did not yield, and, thus were overcomers. The Heavenly Father sends His angles from heaven to give us strength and overcoming power, when we depend upon Him, instead of the arms of flesh.

Memory verse: 2 Peter 1:21.

2. For what purpose are they given? 2 Timothy 3:17.
3. Are these prophecies for us today? And what will they do? Deuteronomy 29:29.
4. What is the last book in the Bible called? Revelation 1:1.
5. What did the Lord God promise those who read these prophecies? Revelation 1:3.
6. How are the Old Testament prophecies given? 2 Peter 1:21.
7. What is said of the interpretation of these prophecies? 2 Peter 1:20.
8. Did the Spirit of Christ have anything to do with the prophets? 1 Peter 1:11.
9. How was the coming of Christ revealed to Peter? 1 Peter 1:11, 12.
10. What are these prophecies to us in our day? 2 Peter 1:19; 1 Corinthians 10:11; Romans 15:4.
11. Will the true elect person, called of the Heavenly Father for eternal life, be fruitful or unfruitful in the work of the Lord at this time? 2 Peter 1:8.

Lesson for January 17, 2026 **RUNNING THE WINNING RACE**

Scripture Reading Psalms 19

Memory Verse Isaiah 40:31

1. How are we admonished to run this race? Heb12: 1, last part.
2. In running, what two things should we lay aside? Verse1 middle part.
3. How is the number of our witness described? Verse 1, first part.
4. To whom should we look while running in this race? Verse 2, first part.

5. What was Solomon's and Paul's observation concerning those who run in this race?
Eccl.9:11, first part, Roman 9:16
6. How is the glory of God, as revealed in the heavenly planets, described? Psa. 19:1-3
7. To what extent is this glory extended? Verses 4,6
8. How is their going compared with him who runs in a race? Verses 5.

Note: - This race is not for the swift, nor is the battle for the strong. Yet King David indicates that it takes a strong man to run a race. Eccl. 9:11 represent those who make sporadic effort in the beginning of their race and quickly fail under tests, while Romans 9:16 represents those who realize their nothingness and seek strength daily in the altar of prayer to endure.

9. What important question did Paul ask the Corinthians about racing? 1 Cor. 9:24. First part.
10. How were they admonished to run? Verse 24, last part.

Note. - There will be no 2nd, 3rd nor consolation prizes at the end of this race. All who will receive eternal life must be overcomers.

11. What is required of those who would win in this race? Verse 25
12. How did Paul run and fight in order to win in this race? verse 26
13. What is said to those who wait on the Lord? Isaiah 40:31

Lesson for January 24, 2026 **GROWING IN GRACE**

3. From where did Jesus see Satan fall? Luke 10:18.
4. Who was cast out of heaven along with Satan? Revelation 12:7-9.
5. Did God spare the angels that sinned? 2 Peter 2:4; Jude, verse 6.
6. Who is the father of lies, and was also the first murderer? John 8:44.
7. In what attitude does our adversary sometimes come? 1 Peter 5:8.
8. In what deceptive way does he appear at other times? 2 Corinthians 11:14,15.
9. Is it possible for the devil to ensnare people? 2 Timothy 2:26.
10. Was the Son of God exempt from temptation? Luke 4:1-13; Hebrews 4:15.
11. Who is the author of sin? 1 John 3:8.
12. Who is the accuser of our brethren? Revelation 12:10.
13. Where will Satan be during the millennial age, while Christ will be reigning upon the throne of David? Revelation 20:1-3.
14. What is said of Satan's final punishment? Revelations 20:10.
15. For whom is the lake of fire prepared? Matthew 25:41

Lesson for February 7, 2026
THE GOOD AND THE BAD FIGS

Scripture reading: Jeremiah 24.

Memory verse: Jeremiah 24:7.

1. Of what are the good figs a type? Jer. 24:5-6.
2. Were the good figs to receive better treatment than the vile ones? Verse 7.
3. What portion of Judah was represented by the vile figs? Verse 8.
4. How were the vile figs to be punished, and would any be left? Verse 9 and 10.

Note: From the forgoing scripture it is very plain that there were two different classes of the Jews that into the exile, and promises were different to each class. He is still able to separate the good from the bad, just as was done back there and He is doing the same today.

5. What class of Jews was to be selected to build the waste cities and do the very work that we see going on here now? Jeremiah 24:1-7.
6. How many blows were struck in destroying the kingdom of Judah? Ezekiel 21: 25-27. Compare 2 Chronicles 36:15-19.

Note: It is said of the gentile enemies of Israel: "As thou hast done it shall be done into thee." - Obadiah 1:15; Joel says: "I will return your recompense upon your own head." - Joel 3:7.

7. In this destruction of the kingdom of Israel 2,500 years ago, were those represented by the evil figs taken away first or last? Compare Jer. 24:8 with 2 Chronicles 36:11,12,16.

Note: Zedekiah and his princes were the evil figs, and they were left, while the good figs were removed, just as it is going to be in the end, the good will be taken first.

8. When were the good figs, including Daniel and his companions, and many others taken away? Daniel 1:1-6.

Note: They were removed with King Jehoiakim and not left at Jerusalem when the terrible destruction came in which men, women and children were given to the sword alike.

9. What especially is said of Daniel concerning his conduct and diet? Daniel 1:7-8.
10. Before the great destruction of the wicked at the end of the gentile period, will the righteous be gathered first? Revelation 14:18.
11. After the cluster of the fruit is gathered then what happens to the wicked compared to the vine of the earth? Verse 19 and 20.
12. Where are we told the righteous will be, who have the victory over the beast and his image, when the plagues fall? Revelation 15:1-6.

Note: Notice particularly that verse 5 says: "After this", that is, after the saints were seen in this place which appeared like a sea of glass to the prophet, he saw the angels come forth with the seven last plagues – Verse 6. Notice also that the battle of Armageddon comes at the time of the 6th plague. - Rev 16:12-15. Hence the righteous are seen assembled somewhere in deliverance from these plagues. Nothing is said where this place is, neither does it say they were caught up as we hear it so often quoted.

Lesson for February 14, 2026 **AS IT WAS IN THE DAYS OF NOAH**

Scripture Reading: St. Matthew 24:1-51.

Memory Verse: St. Matthew 24:37.

1. On one occasion while Jesus was on the Mount of Olives what did His disciples ask Him? Matt. 24:3.
2. To what did Jesus liken the days just before His return? Matt. 24:37.
3. What were some of the sins in the days of Noah? Matt. 24:38; Luke 17:26-27.
4. What account of the wickedness of man is given in Gen. 6:2, 5, 11-13?
5. Amidst all the terrible sins of those days, who alone, with his household, remained faithful? Gen. 7:1.
6. How does the great Apostle Paul speak of Noah? Heb. 11:7.
7. Through whom did God warn the people in those days, when wickedness was very great? 2 Pet. 2:5.
8. What happened after the Master had called faithful Noah and his family (household) into the Ark? Gen. 7:4, 11-12.
9. How complete was the destruction of all flesh? Gen. 7:21-23.
10. For whom, does Peter say the destruction in the days of Noah and Lot, is to be an example? 2 Peter 2:5, 6.

11. The wicked world that was in the days of Noah perished by water. What does the word say will happen to the wicked in the not-too-distant future? 2 Peter 3:6, 7, 10.
12. After all sin and sinners have been destroyed, and the earth has been cleansed by fire, what will be brought to pass? 2 Peter 3:11-13; Isa. 65:17.

Lesson for February 21, 2026

LAST DAY CONDITIONS PRE-ANNOUNCED

Scripture reading: 2 Tim. 3rd chapter.

Memory verse: 2 Tim. 3:14.

1. Describe the perilous times of which Paul spoke and tell when will they take place? 2 Tim. 3:1-7.
2. What did Paul mean in verse 7?
3. Will there a time come when there will be fewer seducers? Verse 13.
4. For what purpose did Paul say that these scriptures were written? Verses 16-17.
5. What will some of the people who think they are the children of God be doing in the last days? 1 Tim. 4:1.
6. What will they be saying, and why? 1 Tim. 4:2.
7. What will be the condition of the rich people in the last days? James 5:1-3.
8. Besides living in pleasure, what have they done? Verse 6.
9. What did James tell the faithful brethren to do? Verses 7-13.
10. In these times of peril, what did Jesus say we should take heed to? Luke 21:34, 35.
11. What was Paul's instruction to the Church for these last days? Heb. 10:25.
12. How will the worldly people act when the Son of man is revealed coming down from Heaven and all the mighty angels with Him Rev. 6:12-17; Matt. 24:30.

Note. — It is evident from all the signs about us that we are living in the last days. Perilous times are here, and it behooves every one of us to lift up our heads for our redemption draweth nigh. — Luke 21:28. Also to be about our Father's business, as profitable servants of the Lord. --- Matt: 24:19-30.

Lesson for February 28, 2026

THE SIGNS OF HIS COMING

Scripture reading: Luke 21:24-36.

Memory verse: Luke 21:36.

1. Is it possible for man to know the exact time of the second coming of Christ? Matthew 24:36.
2. Will the people of the world have any warning of this great event? Luke 21:25.
3. What will be the condition of the world just before the Lord's return? Luke 21:25, 26.
4. When these signs began to pass what will be seen by men, and how will the people of God react? Luke 21: 27, 28.
5. What is said about the condition of Jerusalem during the period when the gospel is going out to all nations? Verse 24.

6. What will it signify when Jerusalem ceases to be trodden down by the Gentiles? Verse 24.
7. What other conditions today (besides the Jews returning to the Promised Land) show us that the end is very near? Verse 25.
8. How does the apostle John speak of the world situation just before the end? Revelation 11:18.
9. What signs are to be observed in the force of nature? Matthew 24:7.

Note. In America alone a major crime is committed every twenty seconds. Never before were there such perilous times. Scientists are now frightened and are prophesying destruction by atomic warfare.

10. What about conditions in the religious and social world just before His return? 2 Timothy 3:1-5.
11. What did the angel tell Daniel about our advanced age of knowledge? Daniel 12:4.

Lesson for March 7, 2026
THE KINGDOM OF GOD IS NEAR, YES
EVEN AT THE DOOR

Scripture reading: Luke 21:24-36.

Memory verse: Luke 21:36.

1. How long were the Jewish people to be scattered in all parts of the world with Jerusalem trodden down by the gentiles? Luke 21:24.
2. What relation was the gospel of the kingdom to have, to the end of the age? Matt. 24:14.
3. While the Jews were scattered among all nations, were the gentiles to be blessed with the gospel news of this coming kingdom? Matt. 24:14.
4. As this gospel draws to a close for the gentiles, and the Jews being gathered back to their homeland, what conditions are we told will exist in the earth? Luke 21:25.
5. What is said about people being fearful of the things which are; coming to pass? Verse 26.
6. What is the last conditions mentioned, relative to the heavens before the Lord Jesus is seen coming in the clouds? Last part of verses 26, 27.

Note. Men's hearts are now failing for fear, of pending destruction by the atomic and hydrogen bombs. The energy is becoming a very serious problem, with many other alarming events happening, which all adds to the confusion which will exist in the last days.

7. Will the remnant people be gloomy and sorrowful when these things are taking place in the earth? V. 28.
8. What simple illustration did Jesus use? V. 29-31.
9. Will the generation of people living to see the return of the Jews from exile among the gentiles, and the distress of nations accompanying it, live to see the return of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ? Verse 32.
10. Is there any way in which we can calculate the number of years in one generation? Matt.

1:17.

Note. It was 1,890 years before Christ when Abram's name was changed to Abraham, and the covenant made with him. We are told that there are 42 generations in this entire period, hence it makes 45 years to one generation. It is significant to note that this is the same as the "waiting time" given by Gabriel to Daniel (Daniel 12:12), when Daniel was to be resurrected. How wonderful to know that we are so near the time when the Lord Jesus will return.

Lesson for March 14, 2026
THE JUDGE OF ALL THE EARTH

Scripture Reading: Genesis 18:16-33.

Memory Verse: Genesis 18:25.

1. In the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah, what is said about the righteous being spared? Genesis 18:23-32.
2. What is said about these cities being examples of the future judgments? 2 Peter 2:6.
3. Should we fear or question the judgment of our Heavenly Father? Psalms 96:10; 1 John 4:16-18.
4. Shall we fear what men may do to us, or rather choose to fall into the hands of a merciful Heavenly Father? 2 Samuel 24:13,14.

Note: David from a boy up, did not live unto himself. The purpose of his life without fear of what the enemy could do, was to bless others. He had the evidence of the presence with him of that powerful intervening hand of deliverance. He slew the lion and the bear, (1 Samuel 17:34-36), and prevailed against the mighty giant of the Philistines, (verses 48,49), — he feared not what men could do.

5. When the Father's presence is with us, will things always go smoothly? Hebrews 12:6, 1 Peter 1:7.
6. What about Job who lost his possessions, and all his children? Job 1:20-22.
7. When his body was sorely afflicted, did he lose faith and complain? Job 7:20,21.

Note: It is well to mark here the humble life of the Saviour, and behold His poverty; His agony in Gethsemane; His reproach in the face of scoffers; a crown of sharp thorns on His head; His trial and condemnation before wicked men as a criminal and His agony of the cross. Yet from all this He arose victorious, triumphant, and was exalted before the very Majesty of heaven, to be crowned as King of kings and Lord of lords.

8. Did Job understand the reason of these afflictions, or try to justify himself? Job 31:3-7, 24-27, & 29,30.
9. Who was it that came to Job with comforting words, and uttered prophecies later to be fulfilled? Job 32:5-10
10. What were some of the comforting words? Job 33:22-29.

11. In his subjection and humility, what did Job finally say? Job 40:3,4; 42:1-6. Please read 1 Peter 4:12,13, & 5:6,7.
12. What is said about the man upon whom the Father brings chastisements? Psalm 94:2-15.
13. What command was given to the three men, ---Job's would be comforters? Job 42:7-9.

Note: The three men who came as Job's friends had wrongly accused him during the period of his affliction. The wrath of God was kindled against them. It was not withdrawn until Job prayed for them.

14. After Job endured with patience, and had prayed for his friends, how was he blessed? Verses 10-16.
15. What is said about mercy and judgment in James 2:12,13?
16. The child Samuel was weaned, and his mother brought him before Eli the high priest. What prophetic words did she speak concerning the Judge of the earth? 1 Samuel 2:10.
17. Did King David also long for this time? Psalms 94:1-3; 96:10-13.
18. What is the conclusion of all that is expected of mankind and does the Great Judge know every secret thing? Ecc. 12:13,14.

Lesson for March 21, 2026 **THE HOME OF THE REDEEMED**

Scripture Reading: Revelation 21.

Memory Verse: Revelation 21:27.

1. Where will the future home of the saved be located? Matt. 5:5; Prov. 10:30; Rev. 5:9,10.

Note: The Lord Jesus told His disciples to pray for the Kingdom to come that the will of the Father might be done on earth as it is in heaven. (Matthew 6:9,10) This earth was not created to be populated always with greedy selfish, covetous men and women, war-mongers, and every sort of sinners. The Creator has power to bring about this pending change, and it is now very near. Although it will require a terrible destruction of lives and property to cleanse the world of sin and sinners, it is sure to come and this time by fire instead of by water as in the days of Noah.

2. Who will be king over all the earth during the period of restitution, or the restoring of the world back to its Eden condition? Rev. 11:15; Isa. 24:23; Psa. 110:1-6.
3. What did Jesus say about the preparation for the redeemed, and His Father's house? John 14:1-3.

Note: Jesus did not say He would send for the redeemed ones to come to where He was going. But He said, "I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also." We are told in many places that when He comes, He will be King and will reign on the earth. The kingdoms of this world will become His. He was born for this purpose. Isaiah 9:6,7.

4. What will happen to the righteous to give them eternal life? 1 Corinthians 15:51-53.
5. What present means will life and health be imparted to the redeemed? Revelation 22:2.
6. Will we be re-united with our loved ones? Jer. 31:16,17.
7. Will our bodies be changed and become the same as the spiritual body of Christ? Philippians 3:20,21.

Note: After Jesus was resurrected from the dead, and therefore possessed this immortal never dying body; He walked with His apostles to the city of Emmaus eight miles northwest of Jerusalem. He also ate with them, but their eyes were holden so they would not recognize Him while walking in the way. Therefore, He looked the same as before, and it was necessary for the eyes of His friends to be changed, because He appeared as before. Then later they recognized Him. (Luke 24:28-31). As our bodies are to be changed and become like unto His glorious body, we will also look the same as we do now, and will know our loved ones, and they will know us.

Lesson for March 28, 2026
THE CALLING OF SERVANTS AND DISTRIBUTION OF GIFTS

Scripture Reading: Matthew 25:14-46.

Memory Verse: Matthew 25:19.

1. To what is the kingdom of heaven compared and who is the one going into the far country? Matthew 25:14.

Note: Christ is still calling servants to labor for Him.

2. What is said about the distribution of talents, or gifts for increasing the fold, and soul winning? Matthew 25:15.
3. What did the servants do who had received the greatest number of talents? Matthew 25:16,17.
4. What did the servant do who received the one talent? Matthew 25:18.
5. What happens after a long time? Matthew 25:19.
6. What is the reward given to those who make proper use of the talents given, and increasing them for soul winning? Matthew 25: 20-23.
7. What is the judgement given to the servant who buries his talent in the earth, not having any increase in his life for the glory of God? Matthew 25:24-28.
8. Instead of entering into the kingdom, what will be said to the unprofitable servant who buries his entire life in this old world? Matthew 25:29-30.

Note: This is what millions are doing today, living entirely for themselves, and buried deeply in all of the crumbling affairs of earth. They seek after money, property, and pleasure, worshipping the dollar only and what it can give to them. A true Israelite is not so. He is developing his talents and living his life for the increase of the kingdom, paying tithe and offerings, as well as living in loving obedience, and separating himself from the world.

9. In following our Saviour's steps whose business will concern us the most? Luke 2:49.
10. Is there not something of far greater value than food for the body and raiment, and what must remain first and foremost in every heart? Luke 12:23-32.
11. What will always happen to the spiritual life of the unfruitful person who buries his talents, failing to bear fruit? Luke 13:6-9.
12. What always happens to the one who lays up in store for himself, burying his talent in the earth, and is not rich toward God? Luke 12:16-21.
